Mike and Charles are meeting regularly and working to meet the goals in his Action Plan. A recent outing found them touring apartments in Lockland to find appropriate affordable housing.





2019 - 2020 HELP Board and Leaders

The Action Plan is a document the mentee creates during the Upward to Work Program, or at a special meeting with the mentor and the Executive Director. The goals are developed by the mentee and the steps to reach those goals are outlined by the Executive Director. The mentor holds the mentee accountable for completing each step and provides additional guidance.

The size of the HELP Program makes it very difficult for the ED to spend one-on-one time with the individual members. The mentor plays a crucial role to ensure the members have personal attention and special assistance when needed.

Members at the Rising Stage are given mentors. This is a major departure from past practices. By waiting until the Rising Stage, we are hoping to ensure that the member is serious about HELP and wants additional guidance to reach their goals. The card below is provided to members at this stage and participating employers, cooperative landlords and partner organizations are being trained to recognize and respect the member for reaching this stage.


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THRIVING STAGE MEMBER SPOTLIGHT

In 2019, Dominic was promoted from Program Coordinator to Director of Reentry. The move was timed to coincide with St. Vincent de Paul's decision to make the Reentry Program a permanent part of the services offered to the region.



After his promotion, Dominic began to develop on the Upward to Work Program in partnership with HELP. The program takes successful programming already offered by St. Vincent de Paul and works it into the full-time employment and Job Training program from HELP.

Last month Dominic was given the Julie K. Martin Award for the services the Reentry Program provides to homeless individuals in Greater Cincinnati. The award was provided by the Greater Cincinnati Homeless Coalition.
